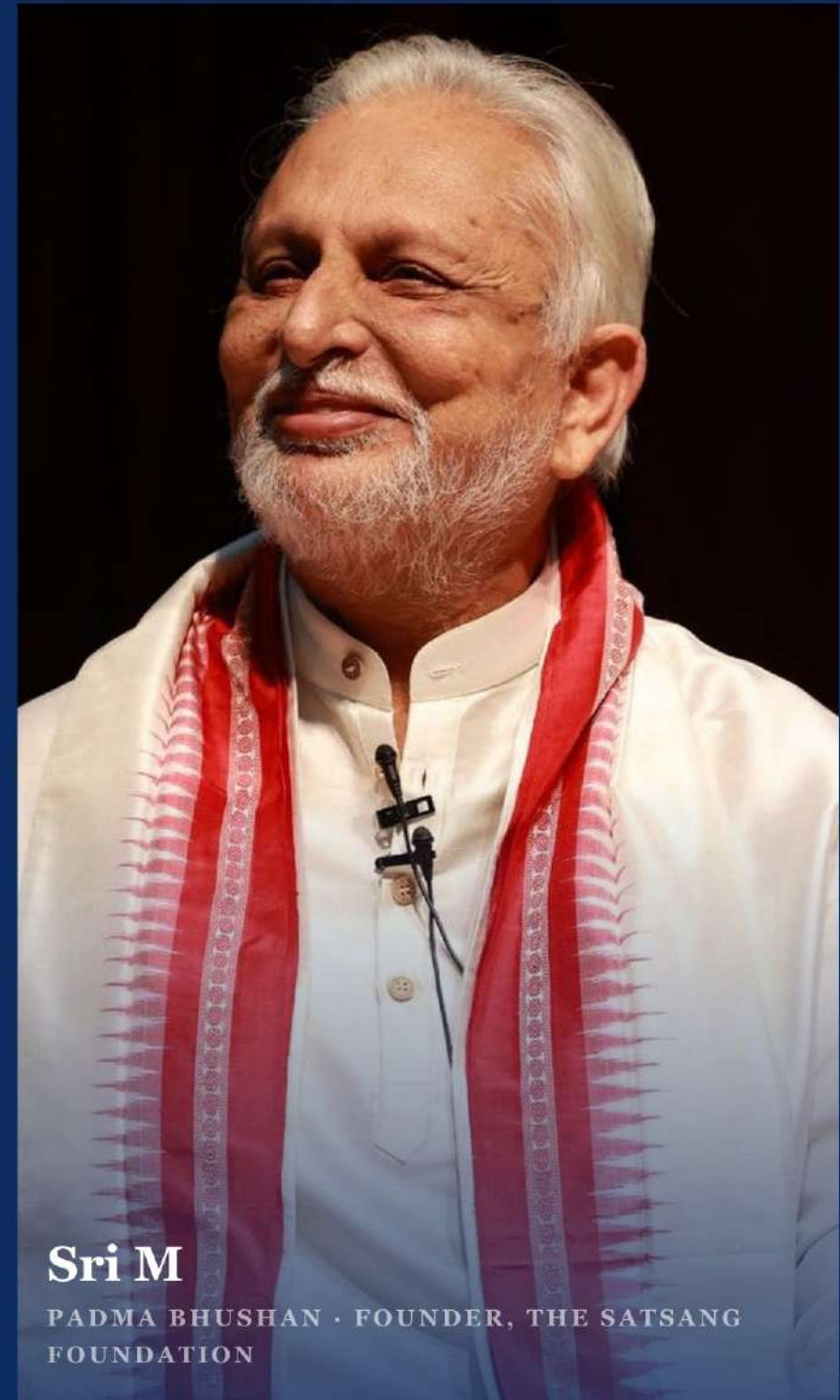

The empathetic and compassionate mission of Sri M to provide free healthcare to the downtrodden has manifested as Swaasthya Hospital at Madanapalle. True to his vision, the hospital's services have taken off in a big way in recent years, becoming a landmark. The goal to provide state-of-the-art medical services — including outpatient, inpatient, critical care, and emergency services — is making good progress year after year, serving more and more people. The ambulance service has made a mark in medical transportation in and around Madanapalle. Advanced diagnostic services have removed the need for people to travel to cities for specialised tests. Continuous outreach camps have linked the unreachable remote tribal communities within a 10-kilometre radius to mainstream healthcare through mobile vans fitted with telemedicine.

The operating rooms offer surgeries at no cost, as does the mother-and-child unit, ensuring a safe motherhood programme. Round-the-clock availability of doctors, periodic specialist visits from Bangalore, and time-framed voluntary services by specialists from across the country have added elegance and satisfaction to the whole system. While I sincerely thank all those who are helping — particularly the wonderful support staff and nurses — I look forward to more volunteers coming forward to take this mission to greater heights. It is still a green-field project, with much more to do and many more milestones to achieve. I offer my heartfelt gratitude to Master Sri M for giving me this opportunity to serve society.

Healing that begins *before the hospital*

In Madanapalle and its surrounding villages, the nearest tertiary hospital is over two hours away. Swaasthya was built to close that gap, not just as a facility, but as a philosophy.

Holistic — body, mind and environment

We treat the root, not the symptom — weaving clinical medicine with Yoga, nutrition counselling, physiotherapy, rehabilitation and meditation.

Accessible — when and where it matters most

Our round-the-clock emergency wing and dedicated cardiac ambulance exist so no life is lost to distance or delay — we show up, at any hour, for anyone.

Free for those who need it most

No patient is ever turned away for inability to pay — not at admission, mid-treatment, or discharge.

Preventive and community-led

Our outreach camps bring free consultations, early screening and health education directly into villages — reaching people who would otherwise never walk through our doors.

• VILLAGE HEALTH CAMPS

Every camp is a clinic on wheels. Doctors, nurses, and paramedical staff travel to villages where the nearest hospital is hours away — conducting screenings, distributing medicines, and referring critical cases. In FY 2025–26, 26 outreach camps reached 2,537 patients across 15 villages, many of whom had never received organised medical attention before.

• SCHOOL HEALTH

Children are the foundation of a healthy community. Swaasthya's school health programme goes beyond a routine check-up — it tracks growth, vision, dental health, and emotional wellbeing, providing individualised reports to parents and schools. In FY 2025–26, 874 children across 6 institutions received comprehensive assessments.

• SPECIALTY CAMPS

Specialist care is often the most difficult to access in rural areas. Swaasthya bridges this gap by bringing visiting consultants from across the region to hold specialty camps in-house. Patients receive neurology, ophthalmology, nephrology, dental, and oncology screenings — without the cost or burden of travelling to a city hospital.

Health is more than the absence of disease. This integrated infrastructure allows patients in and around Madanapalle to receive timely, high-quality treatment closer to home, without the cost, delay, and stress of travelling to distant cities for essential care.

BE THE DIFFERENCE

Swaasthya is not just a hospital. It is a statement — that quality healthcare belongs in every corner of this country, not just its cities. The people who work here understand that. They chose this, deliberately.

If you are a doctor, a nurse, a technician, or an administrator who believes that medicine is a calling — there is a place for you here. Where your skills do not just sustain a career. They sustain lives.

Care that costs *nothing to give*

Swaasthya Hospital was built on a simple promise: the place of your birth should never determine the quality of your care. In FY 2025–26, the vast majority of patients received services either fully free or at deeply subsidised rates — no one was turned away for inability to pay.

For surgeries and deliveries, costs are waived entirely for those who cannot afford them. Across **93 procedures** — 32 deliveries and 61 surgical cases — the total value waived reached **₹40,57,632**.

This is not charity — it is a deliberate model, built to ensure the most vulnerable receive the most care.

1 **New mother • Madanapalle** NICU • Neonatal sepsis

"My baby was born with low weight and soon became critical with a severe infection. The doctors shifted her to the NICU and worked tirelessly through the night. Her condition was very serious, but they never gave up. Now she is fine and we are going home — truly grateful to every doctor and nurse who saved her."

"When my 10-month-old baby fell seriously ill, the ICU and emergency care here were extraordinary. Advanced technology, specialised doctors, and completely free services — I witnessed it all myself. The doctors lifted her from our car and began treatment without a moment's delay. ID was asked only after she was stable. We wholeheartedly recommend this hospital to everyone."

What we are building towards

Four commitments that will shape Swaasthya's next year of care.



Deepening community outreach

Going further into Chittoor's rural belt — more villages, more school health programmes, more disease-specific awareness camps. The need is far larger than what has been met.



Strengthening specialist care

Expanding specialist availability — particularly in cardiology, neurology, and oncology — so patients in Madanapalle and its surrounds no longer face hours of travel for care that can be delivered close to home.



Building a sustainable funding model

Swaasthya's cross-subsidy model works — but it requires a stable, growing base of committed donors. Strengthening institutional partnerships, CSR relationships, and individual giving to protect and expand free care.



Investing in the team

A hospital is only as good as the people in it. Continued investment in staff training, clinical development, and creating an environment where mission-driven professionals want to build their careers.



Pursuing NABH accreditation

Swaasthya is actively working towards NABH accreditation — a national benchmark for patient safety and quality of care. This will formalise the standards we already hold ourselves to.
