Health and beyond

A month of *growing momentum*

Patient attendance continued to strengthen over the last two months, reflecting growing confidence in Swaasthya Hospitals and sustained demand for affordable secondary healthcare services from the surrounding communities — **4,273** total visits and **1,210** new registrations this month.

The increase was primarily driven by outpatient services, while inpatient admissions (**95**) and surgeries (**18**) remained stable, indicating a consistent case mix with improved access to early evaluation and planned care.

The rise in pathology (**1,842** tests) and radiology (**344** procedures) utilisation suggests more patients are receiving comprehensive investigations within the hospital — enabling earlier diagnosis, evidence-based treatment, and reducing dependence on outside diagnostic facilities.

The Swaasthya Walkathon brought together over **1,000** participants from schools, colleges, local communities, and the police — the month's most impactful outreach initiative, strengthening awareness about healthy living and community togetherness alongside a Neurology camp, dental camp, and blood donation drive. The team also came together to celebrate Doctors' Day this month, honouring the clinicians whose care anchors everything above.

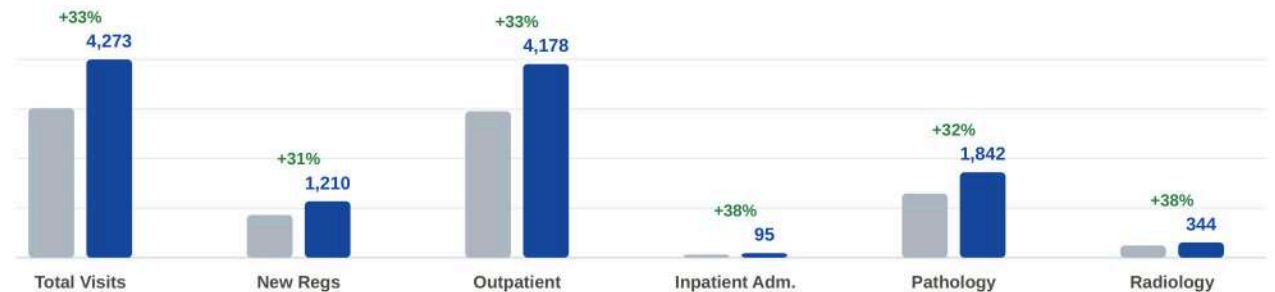

OUTREACH INITIATIVE 30 July

Swaasthya Walkathon 2026

1,000+ participants **3 km** community walk **15+** schools & institutions

Swaasthya Hospitals organised the Swaasthya Walkathon 2026 on 30 July as part of the Guru Purnima celebrations. Over 1,000 participants — students, teachers, healthcare professionals, police personnel, and local residents — walked 3 km through Madanapalle together.

The event celebrated the shared values of health, education, environmental responsibility, and social harmony. By uniting educational institutions, healthcare organisations, public service departments, and local residents, it strengthened community bonds and reinforced the message that lasting social change begins when people walk together with a common purpose.



SPECIALTY CAMP 14 July

Neurology Specialty Consultation Camp

56 consultations **17** elevated BP **7** cerebrovascular dx

Swaasthya Hospitals ran a dedicated Neurology Specialty Consultation Camp on 14 July 2026, with eminent neurosurgeon Dr N K Venkataramana visiting to lead the team, bringing expert neurological care within reach of underserved communities. Together they saw 56 patients — 30 women and 26 men, ages 3 to 94 — drawn from Madanapalle and surrounding villages including Kalicherla, B. Kothakota, Thambalapalle, Kadiri, and Reddyvaripalli, among others.

The camp turned up a wide range of conditions needing prompt attention: 17 patients had elevated blood pressure, and 7 were found to have serious cerebrovascular conditions, including stroke, cortical venous thrombosis, and carotid ischemia. The team also treated epilepsy, headache disorders, movement disorders, neuropathies, and degenerative spine disease, referring patients on for further testing or follow-up where needed — catching problems earlier and cutting the wait for specialist care in the region.

MOST SIGNIFICANT CASE

STABILISING A CRITICALLY ILL PATIENT WITH RESPIRATORY FAILURE

Patient: 71F, ICU · **Diagnosis:** Chronic cor pulmonale with moderate pulmonary hypertension, chronic hypoxia (OSA), viral pneumonia, hyperkalemia

A 71-year-old woman with a history of hypertension presented with severe breathlessness and low oxygen saturation. She was admitted and managed with oxygen therapy, serial blood gas monitoring, non-invasive ventilation, antibiotics, antiviral therapy, and correction of electrolyte imbalance. With continuous monitoring and timely escalation of respiratory support, her condition stabilised and she was weaned off support and discharged in stable condition.

Why it matters: this case shows the hospital's ability to deliver timely critical care and multidisciplinary management for elderly patients with complex cardiopulmonary disease — achieving stabilisation without invasive mechanical ventilation.

A ROUTINE MONTH OF GOOD CARE

JULY: A MONTH OF TWINS · SIX NEWBORNS, ONE DEDICATED TEAM

Patients: Mother & Child Ward, NICU · three high-risk twin deliveries

July saw three sets of twins — six newborns — delivered and cared for successfully, all high-risk late-preterm gestations. Obstetricians, pediatricians, nursing staff, lactation counsellors, and orthopedic specialists worked together on stabilisation, feeding, temperature regulation, and screening. All six babies were discharged home in stable condition, several after establishing successful breastfeeding despite being late preterm and low birth weight.
